SHOW TOXIC CHAT THE RED CARD

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DEFEND AGAINST SCAMMERS

EA does contact players via email (although not to oak for usemennes or passwords, so watch out for that scam tactic), but never through the game itself - so be wary of incoming messages and consider blocking and reporting suspacted spam. Your child should divid buying coins (the in-pame summay) from external sites; it could end with them tosing their money and being basined from the game.

AVOID EXTRA TIME
