A message from Mr Kilsby

Since we returned to school in September, we have been busy rolling out our new English curriculum. The design of this curriculum was a major piece of work for us; involving detailed research and careful planning and so it has been fantastic to finally get to launch it in the classrooms. The major difference with the previous English curriculum at the school is the focus on developing the children's oral language comprehension as the research highlights the link between this and a child's ability to read and write with increasing sophistication and effectiveness. This all requires the teachers to plan and deliver sequences of lessons that not only lead to a clearly defined outcome, but also ensure that all children are exposed to carefully selected language. This is with the aim of not merely increasing the number of words that the children understand, but are also able to use accurately in their oral responses and written work. Consequently, whether the focus on the English lesson is reading, writing, grammar, punctuation, spelling, handwriting or oracy, the teachers will be constantly looking to promote the development of the children's oral language comprehension. It is our aim that all children at CPS are able to communicate and comprehend with confidence, and we believe that our new English curriculum is the vehicle to achieving this. To support this we have also introduced a number of approaches and initiatives, including a standardised spelling programme across KS2 that builds upon the Read, Write, Inc Phonics programme used in EYFS and KS1, and a focus on handwriting that begins in EYFS and is then developed through to the end of Year 6. We have also used the Speech and Language Link programme to identify any EYFS child who may have communication, speech and language delays; with short-term 'catch-up and keep-up' interventions delivered, if necessary. All of this is very exciting for us and we will be evaluating the impact carefully across the rest of this year and beyond and I look forward to sharing the outcome of this with you.
